MINUTES OF COMMITTEE MEETING. TUESDAY 12TH MAY 19.30

#### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Chairs report - May 2015

- 1. Of the thirteen letters I sent out in April, to people on the waiting list either their phone + email didn't work or was non existent. I have now had five replies in total.
- 2. Plot 168A spoke to him on 28<sup>th</sup> March assured me he would be working on the plot in the next two weeks. He didn't. (Christine spoke to him too as he had not paid his rent). Non cultivation letter hand delivered Sunday evening 19<sup>th</sup> April. Plus further reminder about the rent. Termination letter hand delivered on Sunday 3<sup>rd</sup> May as no work done on the plot at all this year and no plan received.
- 3. Sunflower seeds handed out to allotment children around 20 are going to have a go.

- 4. Meeting with Alison Jones (Pathways), Bettina, Don (Haslemere), Christine and myself at Lido house on Tuesday 5<sup>th</sup> May.
- Bettina asked for copy of spreadsheet to find out who had not paid at Haslemere. Haider is busy at the moment with an audit – so Alison suggested we give 5 days notice if we want this sort of information. We have had this info for some time – so, I sent Haslemere an old (8<sup>th</sup> April) version.
- Bettina also asked about water meter reading. They had read Haslemere's meter and passed on info to Pathways. I mentioned we read the meter and contact Thames Water direct.
- They will consider if we can use the plots for photo shoots to make some extra money for maintenance.
- At the last Pathways meeting we asked for clarification on bonfire times as it is not clear in the tenancy agreement. Alison did not have the answer for this meeting. I have stressed we need to know as soon as possible as everyone will be having bonfires in the next few months.
- Reported on our committee discussion on what makes an orchard will liaise with Haslemere committee.
- Mentioned we will start to get commercial waste collection and will report back on how it goes.
- Mentioned break-ins and rough sleeper. Alison suggested we talk to the people at St John's Church as they may have contacts that can help.
- Alison mentioned that at one of their meetings someone suggested some of the plots were looking "untidy". I suggested those people could come along to a volunteer session to help out ;-) That way they could find out for themselves how long it takes to clear up a whole site. I will add them to the volunteer list!!!

After the Pathways meeting – Christine and I did a site inspection. See Secretary's report for list of non-cultivation letters and reminder letters to be sent out.

### TREASURER'S REPORT.

The Bank Account has approx. £1200 in it.

- £500 has been paid in and the skips have been paid
- Pathways money will come in one cheque.

## SECRETARY'S REPORT.

(ongoing) Christine is continuing to check any Communications coming in to Pathways. Because of the system in Pathways it takes a little while to get confirmation to Christine on payments etc.

"Applications still coming in steadily as are the plot payments. Haider updating us as new ones come in. Most are now paid. I suggest that I produce a detailed update at our next (June) meeting on paying patterns with suggestions for next year.

A good meeting with Pathways on the 5<sup>th</sup>.

I missed the beginning, these are my notes

- 1) Amendment to agreement that they are responsible for repairs and will get quotes it was agreed that we (the management teams for both sites) might be able to do some repairs more economically.
- 2) It was proposed that there should be a maximum of 2 trees per half plot as from an agreed date for all plotholders. Existing trees will not be required to be removed unless of course they constitute an 'orchard'.
- 3) Pathways to clarify Bonfire times ASAP (N.B. this was a request from the last quarterly meeting still not addressed by Pathways!)
- 4) Water- each site to decide on timings for turn on/off with the default being 1<sup>st</sup> May and (?) 1<sup>st</sup> Oct
- 5) Rough sleepers- it was suggested we could talk to the church regarding this as they run a soup kitchen and have contact with those who are , perhaps, using our site.
- 6) Fund raising photo shoots and location parking Alison will consult with the SMT regarding this.

Site inspection 5<sup>th</sup> May 2015

Christina and I inspected the site.

All the following were sent an email apart from 2 who do not have one registered with us.

Letters went out as well to make sure the message was received. Apart from 3 who responded very quickly to the email before the letters were posted!
